**Bristol Samaritans have approximately 180 dedicated volunteers of all ages, interests and backgrounds. But we always need more volunteers to help keep our telephone lines open providing emotional support to those in the local community who may want it.**

**Who We Are.** Samaritans were started in London in 1953 by the Rev. Chad Varah and are the oldest telephone helpline service in the country. Although an ordained Priest, Chad Varah set up Samaritans specifically as a non-religious charity of which there are now 201 autonomous branches in the UK and Republic of Ireland. Bristol branch opened in 1964 and is based in the city centre at 37 St Nicholas Street, Bristol, BS1 1TP (*just off Corn Street*).

**What We Do.** Samaritans are available 24 hours a day to provide confidential emotional support for people who are experiencing feelings of distress or despair, including those that may lead to suicide. Our Volunteers provide a free service and believe being listened to, in confidence, and accepted without prejudice or being judged, can alleviate these feelings. We also believe everyone has the right to make fundamental decisions about their own life, including the decision to die by suicide if they so wish.

**The Volunteers We Are Looking For.** Anyone 18 years old or over can be a Samaritan listening volunteer providing they care about other human beings, are good "active" listeners and are prepared to work within the Samaritan principles of confidentiality and being non-judgemental whatever the issues involved. Our volunteers do not give Callers advice or material support of any kind. We also need non-listening volunteers to assist with various administration and fund raising activities vital to keep the branch running successfully. **The Application Process.** Potential Volunteers are requested to attend an Information Evening which are held in our Centre on the first Monday of every month at 7:15 pm where your questions will be answered. Please note there are two flights of stairs so if this would prevent you attending please let us know and we'll contact you. If you decide to join you will be given an application form and asked to provide names of two referees and invited to attend a Selection Day, usually held on a Sunday. During this day we explain in more detail what we do, have a one to one talk with you and run simple activities to see if you are the sort of person we are looking for. Successful applicants will be invited to attend our initial training and Criminal Record Bureau checks will be carried out on volunteers who join us to protect our Callers, some of whom may be vulnerable.

**Training given to new Volunteers.** For volunteers selected for listener training we provide 8 initial training modules of 3 hours each over a six-week period. This is followed by a further 5 modules over a six month probationary period during which the volunteer answers calls on our emergency lines. Listening volunteers must also complete a minimum of 5 hours ongoing training every year.

**Time Contribution Expected from Volunteers.** New listening volunteers are supported by experienced volunteers and are asked to do regular listening duties of approximately four hours each - up to one duty a week depending on the time of day you do them. It is essential that we fully man our Centre at night and so all volunteers will be expected to do a night duty (02:00 - 07:00) every two months.

**Some Facts and Figures.** There were almost 5.1 million contacts made to Samaritans in the UK and Republic of Ireland in 2009 there were 6202 people who decided to take their own life (one person every 85 minutes). The figures suggest more than 70 of these self inflicted deaths were in the area covered by Bristol Samaritans who received 56,730 contacts from Callers in 2011. The vast majority of these contacts were made by telephone but 4,762 of them were made by Email, SMS Texting or Face-to-Face visits to our Centre in Bristol. We also support Horfield men's prison and Eastwood Park women's prison by training inmates as "Listeners" to work with other prisoners who may need emotional support whilst serving their sentence.
