Going for Gold in 2019

NEXT year sees the fiftieth anniversary of the Walsall and District Branch of Samaritans - and we need YOU to help us commemorate our golden year.

It's hard to believe that it was in 1969 that the branch opened its phonelines for the very first time at premises in Glebe Street. Since then, the branch has moved to Bott Lane and receives an average of 900 calls every month, and in its halfcentury has dealt with some half a million calls!

Since its inception in 1953 by Chad Varah, Samaritans has expanded its service throughout the UK, and now has 201 branches with 21,000 volunteers providing a listening service 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Walsall and District Director, Adrianne Carter, says she is proud and privileged to be leading the branch in its fiftieth year.

"It's a great achievement to have kept the Walsall branch going over the course of fifty years," said Adrianne.

"We continue to go from strength to strength and are always looking at new forms of communication technology so that all demographics can contact us."

Next March will see the introduction of instant messaging as a new means on communication for callers, in addition to the existing text messaging, email and telephone call services.

The branch has set up a 50th anniversary working group who are keen to hear from former Samaritans who have memories of volunteering in the past, as well as anyone who may have been helped by the branch over its years of service to the town and who may want to share their experiences.
